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Κε	 The children's personalised Christmas cards and gifts proved popular again raising £304.85. Taking advantage of the early bird discounts meant that although we had fewer school children relative to previous years, we made a similar profit. Keeping on the theme of gifts, the Mother's Day and Father's Day gifts were again a good source of income for the PTFA raising a total of £511.80. Our first sponsored event for this team – The Colwich Kilometre - was our best earner making £2,489.80 profit. It was also by far the cheapest event to run at a mere £150.25 and compared to our other events required less organisation and setup. All cake sales have been very successful generating profit of £525.11. The Village Summer Fair was less successful this year taking a profit of only £652.95 almost half of last year's profit.
